#### Site History.

In 2001 Deeping St James Parish Council began the task of raising money to facilitate a skate park. It took two years to raise the money needed to prepare the ground, install drainage, prepare a specification, go through the tender process and find the most competitive supplier for the skate park equipment and the multi activity sports area. In the summer of 2003, the project was finally completed. This had involved several public consultations, donations from local companies, meetings with the young people of the Community – to ensure they had enough input into the plan for the skate ramps and other features.

The installation of the metal ramps has been a huge success, as evidenced by Lincolnshire Police being impressed by the reduction in anti-social behaviour. They donated towards the building of a youth shelter at the site.

#### Renewal of the skate park.

The metal ramps had a supplier guarantee period of ten years and by 2014 the ramps were beginning to show signs of wear. The Parish Council decided to carry out extensive work during the next two years – continuing with the regular safety inspections and maintenance programme to ensure the skate park remained operational as an important facility for the young people of the community.


Originally metal ramps had been deemed to be the best available but since installation the design of facilities for skate boarding had moved on a very long way. The Parish Council were supportive of the young people who wanted to bring this extremely popular facility up to date. It was agreed that it was necessary to replace the metal equipment (half pipes, quarter pipes, fun boxes and ramps) with a new concrete skate park. Consultations started again both with the public, and the young people. This time it seemed that the challenge to raise the funding for this, was greater than before. Budgets everywhere were tighter and in total it took nearly three years. The users were involved with this – including supporting the aim to have skate boarding adopted as an Olympic sport.

This area of land is known as Woody Heights, a name chosen by young people. The new facility has promoted board and skating sport locally with many travelling from outside the area. Professional skaters have deemed it to be one the best in the Country. The Parish Council are extremely proud of what has been achieved and wish to protect this valuable, popular and important local green space.

THOMAS MALDWYN BRAND — Put outside gym equipment in it as not everyone can afford gym. They have one at Ferry Meadows.

LOUISE MCNALLY – They have this at Rutland Water and you see every generation using the equipment. Encourage people to have a go and it's free.

MARK LEWIS – It needs updating. I used to bmx 10 years ago, and loads of memories. Deeping is growing and people still use it, why take away what little there actually is for youngsters to do in Deeping. They need a place to go so crime isn't something they go into. KATHERINE ROBINSON – This is a great place for older children. I'd definitely like to see it updated and given a face lift.

EMMA WOOD – I think update the skate park and add a gym area as kids can play while parents exercise! I loved the skate park as a teen. We do have a fitness park in Deeping already. I know, but one with proper park gym equipment like they have in London would be lovely.

KERRIE FISH – So many people use it! Upgrade and improve it. It will be so worth it. Maybe extend the bmx trail so younger ones can ride their bikes and scooters to, as its hard to get a look in when the skate Park is full of older children.

SAM YOUNG — Needs to be rebuilt like Stamford or Spalding. The state of its in a bad condition, do not tear it down. Look at all the comments, they want a new one and not torn down. Deepings, you've said you were going to fund a new skate park......4 years! Still we haven't got one.

STACEY NEWLAND – I'd like the gym stuff to, like what they have at Elsea Park.

NATHAN BEDFORD – There's no need to tear it down to make a new one, just make the new one the other side of the hill. That way beginner can use the old one which leaves the new one for people to progress. At the minute it is too small to do that and for the amount of people there. Also it will cost money to take the old one down, so you might as well use that money for the new skate park.

EMMA WOOD – Parkour/free running equipment would be another idea to incorporate. It's huge in other towns and absolutely hands down the best exercise for kids and adults alike.

TERRY LANGRIDGE – You contradict yourself by saying "over the years it has been well used", so why the need for change. It will tear the kids away from those ipads etc, and will actually get them to do exercise.

HEIDI EDWARDS – Both my boys use it, and love it, please don't get rid of it, just update it. The one at Stanground is brill, and that's always busy to. Listen to the kids, they still want the skate park but would like it updating.

ADRIAN ELMER – Bring it to Langtoft…cuz there isn't much for kids to do here.

LYNETTE HOLMES – My son uses the skate park all the time. Does need an update, but please don't get rid of it.

JOHN BOORMAN – Please, please keep it, and more so, improve it. Jubilee has a great bmx track and this summer holiday my boy spent 90% at the bmx track. He also uses the skate track so often with skating or bmxing. I wholeheartedly recommend improvements for the skaters and BMX users. I also agree with lain Toombs, why not ask the kids what they would like to see there, as they know what its lacking. I spent an hour in the car on Saturday with 4 boys that had just been to Adrenalin Alley in Corby. The conversation went on for an hour, non-stop, about the variety of skate board jumps and BMX ramps they had used.

Deeping St James Parish Council please hold a meeting on this and invite the kids as they will give you an invaluable insight into what they would like to have there. Finally, I do wish there was more for the teenage girls to do as well.

CAROLE BREMNER – The BMX track is on the John Eve Park opposite Tesco, not on the Jubilee which is behind the shops on Thackers Way.

SUSAN CAYLEY - Kids love it, needs updating

SHARON HALL – Keep it as a skate park with a re-vamp/facelift. There isn't to much for teenagers to do around Deeping and they enjoy going to this park.

CHRIS QUINN – As an avid adult skater I frequent Adrenaline Alley in Corby quite regularly, have a Google at the level skate park in Brighton, it's a concrete outdoor park and one of the best in Europe. It attracts people of all ages. If any adult input is needed then I would be happy toi assist. Please don't lose the skate park, it needs a major revamp but it should be completed and could be an asset to Deepings.

JUDY STEVENS - Adult input is def needed

ANDREW BOWELL - Hi Chris. Thank you very much. As Judy says adult input is needed. Are you available to help with applying for grants, or engaging with the schools and businesses?

JUDY STEVENS - Wooha! - we need a meeting and can then a plan and to have adults who are engaging with the skate park already will be a real boon - I am sure that John, Chris and others will be able to contribute positively - so look forward to a get together - there is already a steering group on the parish council and they will be in touch

LORRAINE SHEFFIELD – Yes keep it. My boys have started going. It would be nice if there was a younger bit and older bit.

CHRIS QUINN — Hi Lorraine, a younger bit and an older bit wouldn't really differ. If it was revamped then they would need to just add in maybe a mini ramp that can still be used for all ages. In the indoor park in Corby there are children as young as 3 years old risind the same ramps as the adults. It's pretty impressive.

LISA HARDEN – My son goes to the skate park, and my youngest son can't wait to be old enough to go to. I think upgrading the skate park is a wonderful idea; please do not take it away for something else. So many kids use it. They get great exercise, stay out of trouble, socialise safely, and have great fun. I agree, ask the kids for input, but you will find an improved skate park will go down a treat.

JUDY STEVENS – Chris Quinn and John Boorman, would you be prepared to be on a group to get this going.
